



Sandhills Community Primary School

The Governors of Sandhills Community Primary School have agreed the following Principles of Behaviour in the school.

- All members of the school community will be treated fairly, without discrimination because of race, ethnic origin, sex or religion. All members of our school community should be free from harassment, bullying and discrimination.
- All children, staff and visitors have the right to feel safe at all times at Sandhills School. We expect all members of the school community to treat each other with respect. Pupils will be taught good manners and expected to show politeness towards each other and to staff.
- The School rules of:
 - Stay Safe
 - Do your best
 - Show Respect

are clearly set out in the Behaviour Policy and displayed around School. Governors expect these rules to be consistently applied by all staff.

- The Governors expect pupils to maintain an orderly climate for learning and ask that parents support the staff in this.
- The Governors wish to emphasise that violence, threatening behaviour or abuse by pupils or parents towards the school's staff will not be tolerated.
- The Governors strongly believe that high standards of behaviour lie at the heart of a successful school. Good teaching and learning promote good behaviour and good behaviour promotes effective learning. Governors also believe that the expectation of high standards of behaviour which are required during the school day can have a positive effect on the life of young people outside school in encouraging them to become responsible and successful citizens.
