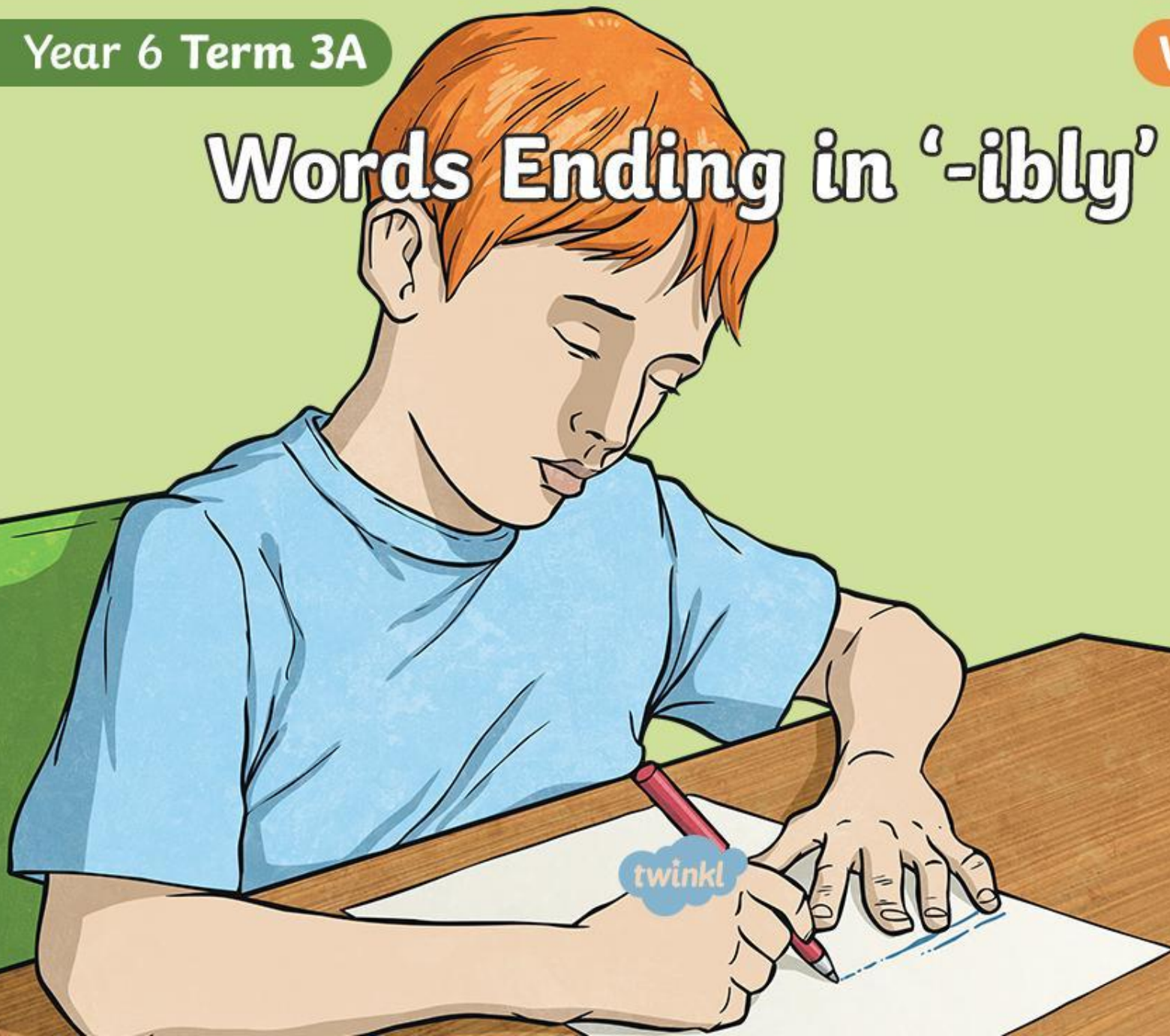



Words Ending in '-ibly'

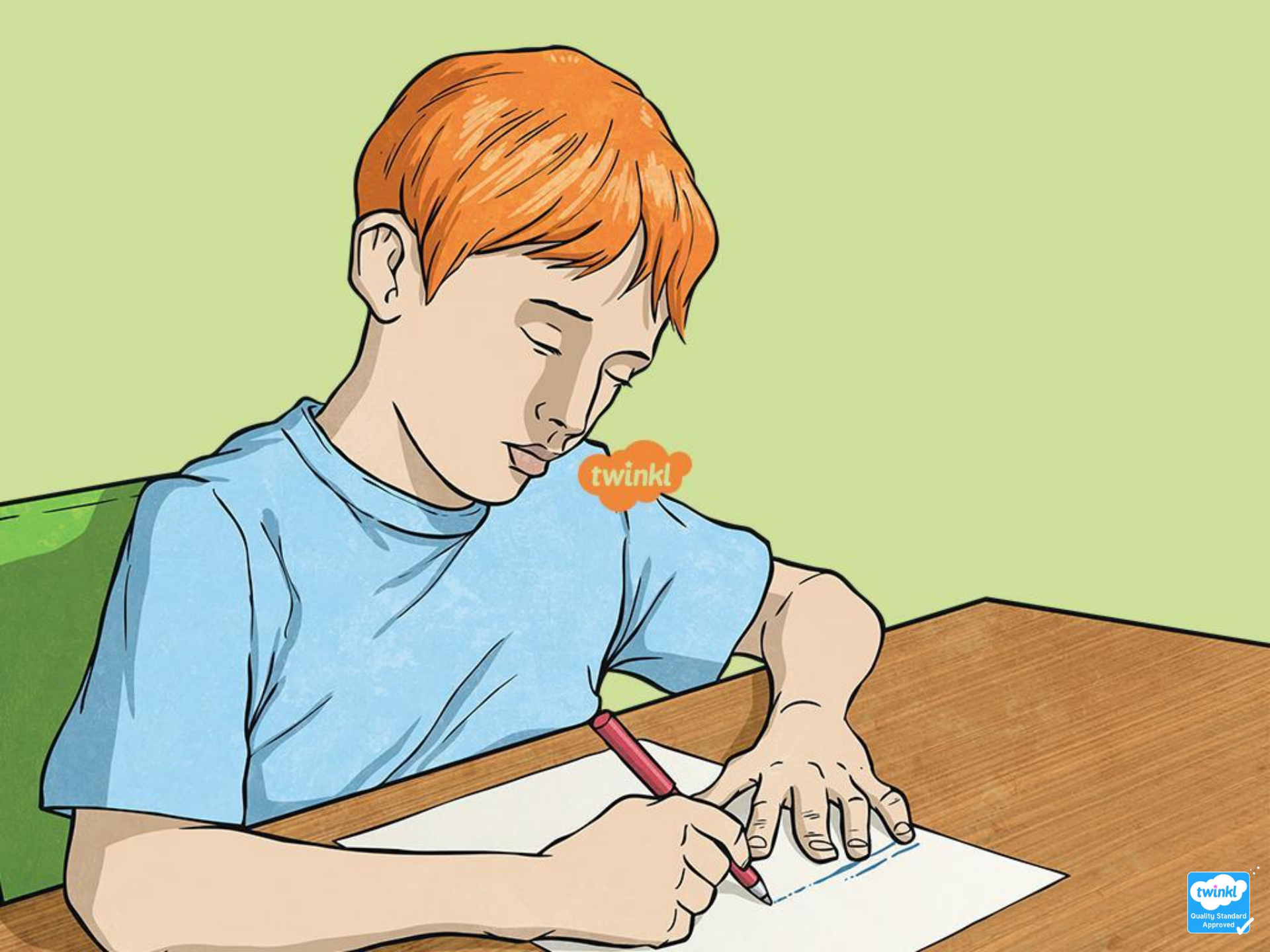
