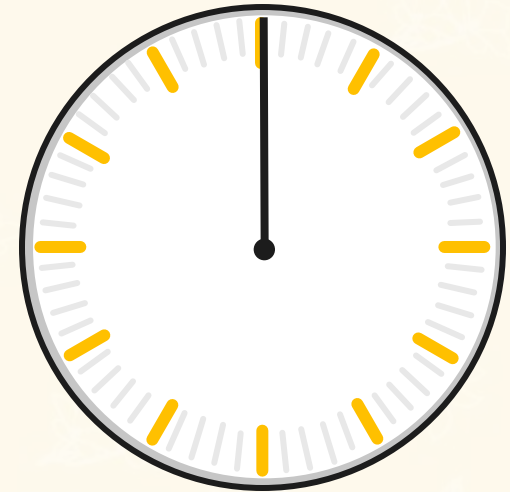


This week, we are again looking at synonyms and antonyms relating to mood instead of using 'happy' or 'sad'.
